COMPENSATION FOR CONTRACTING COVID-19 AT WORK

Are you a worker who has tested positive for COVID-19 and have related medical bills or unpaid quarantine time?

- ◆ Under a new state law, if you are a frontline worker* and you test positive for COVID-19, Labor and Industries (L&I) will accept that your illness is work related and approve your claim, unless your employer presents evidence that you contracted COVID-19 outside of work.
- ◆ You can get medical bills paid and partial wage replacement for the days of work you miss due to an order of quarantine or COVID-19 illness.





How can you claim benefits?





- ◆ To claim benefits, file a workers compensation claim either over the telephone (call 1-877-561-3453), online (https://secure.lni.wa.gov/home/ default.aspx?rfs=PleaseSign%20In), or at a medical clinic.
- ◆ The new law applies to COVID-19 contracted after May 11, 2021. If you contracted COVID-19 prior to that date, you might still qualify, but you will need additional evidence to show that you contracted it at work.
